Harold B. and Helen N. Shapira Scholarship

The *Harold B. and Helen N. Shapira Scholarship* was established in 1987 and devotes assistance to Jewish students.

Eligibility

To be considered for the above scholarships, you must be an undergraduate, graduate, or professional student enrolled full time in a degree program at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities.

Awards are based on an applicant's:

- involvement in the Jewish community;
- volunteer activities in the Jewish or greater communities;
- awards received;
- academic standing at the University of Minnesota;
- career track as an indicator of any future contributions that benefit humankind.

Applying

Applications for the scholarship should include:

- a completed application form (on page 2) including a statement describing how the applicant has served and/or plans to serve humankind;
- a chronological résumé.

The postmark deadline for this scholarship is June 2. Award notices will be sent mid-July. Please send your completed application to:
